

What were the impact of the Railways in the UK?

Subject Specific Vocabulary:

Settlement - a place where people establish a community.

Population - all the inhabitants of a particular place

Census - procedure of counting, recording and publishing population information.

Industry - processing of raw materials and manufacture of goods in factories.

Infrastructure - the basic physical and organizational structures and facilities

Residential - designed for people to live in

Transport - take or carry (people or goods) from one place to another by means of a vehicle, aircraft, or ship

Migration - movement from one part of something to another

Network - a group or system of interconnected people or things.

Commercial - involving buying and selling of goods.

Key Dates and Figures

1819 first railway line built through Kirkby to transport coal from Derbyshire to Mansfield

1848- first passenger railway station built in Kirkby by Midland Railway. It was called Kirkby-in-Ashfield East

1890: First shaft sunk at Kirkby Colliery

1893- Kirkby Bentinck station opens

1895- Bentinck Colliery opens

1917- Kirkby-in-Ashfield Central station opens

1963 Kirkby Bentinck Station closes

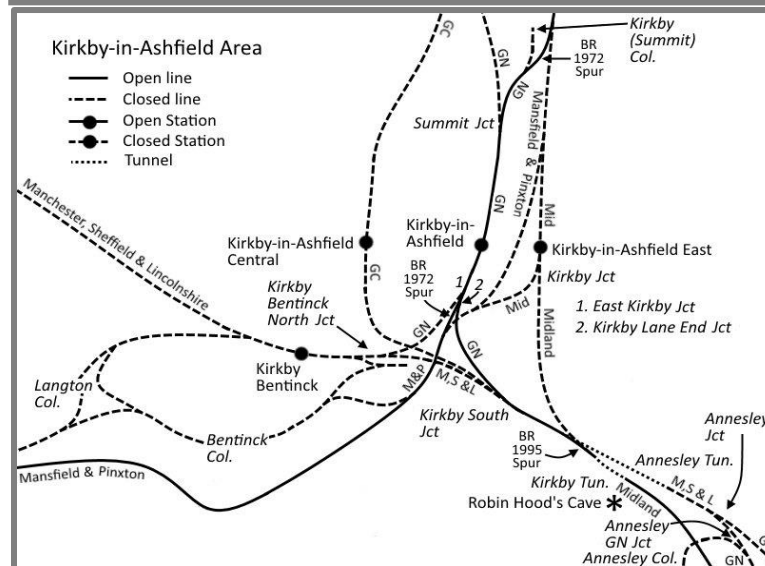
1965- Kirkby in Ashfield East station closes

1968- Kirkby Colliery shuts.

1962- Kirkby-in-Ashfield Central closes

1990's reopening of Midland route Robin Hood line from Nottingham to Worksop

2000- Bentinck colliery closes
